



Dr. Kevin Burden (BA; MA; PGCE; PhD) – Director of the Constellation Trust

Kevin studied history and politics at Lancaster University (1997-80) and after graduating in 1980 he trained to be a history teacher at Loughborough University. Kevin later taught at various schools from London to Hull.

Kevin has worked at the University of Hull from 1999 during which time he has held several roles and responsibilities. In 2005 he secured funding from the National College of School Leadership to deliver their Strategic Leadership for ICT programme (SLICT) and worked with over 150 school leaders from across the country to support them in their strategic adoption and use of technology in schools.

Kevin has worked extensively with schools and teachers to develop school-based professional development and action research including programmes across the UK and in Hong Kong. He was responsible for extending the Masters programme into Africa and has supported the professional development of teachers in Nigeria and Ghana.

In 2015 Kevin's expertise and excellence in teaching and learning was recognised by the Higher Education Academy (HEA) and he was awarded one of only 50 National Teaching Fellowships in recognition of this. As a professor in educational technology he works with colleagues across the university to embed the effective use of technology in teaching and learning and to consider the appropriate adoption and use of emerging technologies such as hybrid realities, Big Data and Artificial Intelligence (AI). Kevin is currently Professor in Educational Technology and National Teaching Fellow (HEA) at the University of Hull.
